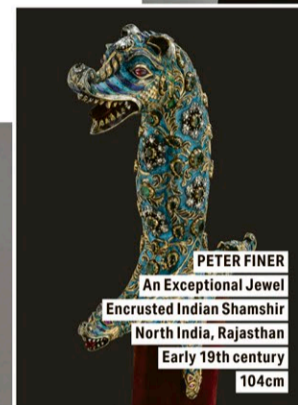
Asian Art in London celebrates its 24th anniversary

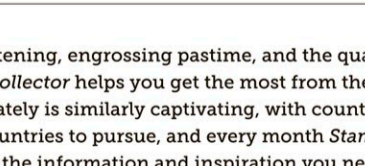
