Dorotheum will auction almost 240 carpets and textiles at their Vienna salesroom on **Tuesday 19 October 2021**. The auction will include some rare and high-quality pieces including two exceptional silk carpets from Heriz in Iran (Lot 69, Heriz silk Vaq-Vaq carpet, 3.60 x 2.70 m, estimate £38,000 and Lot 182, Heriz silk 2.20 x 1.80 m, estimate £19,000).

The sale will also offer a collection of south Persian tribal rugs (Lot 79, chamseh, estimate &epsilon3,800); a group of Turkmen pieces; and a 17th-century Kerman vase carpet (Lot 137, 2.85 x 2.00 m, estimate &epsilon60,000). A group of classic Persian carpets including Kashan Mohtashams, Esfahan Seirafian/Mashad Sabers and a Kashan Meshehir will also be on sale.

Viewers will be surprised by an unusual early Tibetan tiger rug (Lot 134, estimate €4,000). Lot 135 is a large Peking carpet with a lotus design (7.52×4.50 m), and there are several examples of collectable Caucasian carpets (Lot 123, Marasali rug, estimate €9,000). There will also be a fine ivory Ushak carpet on offer (Lot 50); a bold Serapi carpet (Lot 52); and some high-quality tapestries.



'Ships and Passages: Alfred Steinmann's research on the ship motif in Indonesia' will be presented by Drs.
